Renée A. Daugherty, Ph.D.

Professor Emeritus, Oklahoma State University
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Daugherty was a high school librarian before joining the OSU-Stillwater faculty in 1978 with an appointment in the Oklahoma Cooperative Extension Service. She earned a doctorate in Human Environmental Sciences (Administration and Education) from Oklahoma State University, as well as M.S. and B.S. in Education. As an OSU faculty member and OCES state specialist, she was responsible for Extension programs on community leadership and Extension teaching methods giving leadership to the following programs:

- Extension Teaching Methods program – teaching methods for adults and older youth
- Initiative for the Future of Rural Oklahoma – a leadership and community development program helping citizens to develop skills to enhance the quality of life in their communities
- Citizen Engagement through Public Deliberation Program
- LeadershipPlenty – a community leadership development curriculum developed by the Pew Partnership for Civic Change

Following her retirement in 2010, Daugherty relocated from Stillwater to the Tulsa area. She currently works 20% time for OSU to support public deliberation in Oklahoma as well as community leadership development. Dr. Daugherty has been involved with approximately 250-300 deliberative forums in Oklahoma as well as other states and countries.
